It was a Starmaker Theatre Company performance of *Annie* in 1998 that drew me back into the captivating world of theatre. Curtain down, I bumped into a friend who morphed into a persuasive Reading Operatic Society member. The rest, as they say, is history. That's why I offer a poignant and warm welcome to one of the most popular shows on the circuit.

Twenty years on, *Annie* remains as timeless and full of can-do energy as ever, brought to vivid life by our talented group of actors, directed and choreographed by award winning Nick Brannam and musically directed by Josh Robinson with his 10-piece orchestra. They are all enabled by Reading Operatic Society's hugely capable and often under-appreciated production management, back stage crew, front of house team, friends and tireless committee.

The bit that has changed substantially over two decades is the cost of production. Even with tight controls, we will spend nearly £22,000 to ensure a great show here at the Kenton. Not quite 'Daddy' Warbucks territory, but a real challenge. My sincere thanks to all supporters named in this programme. Without their assistance, Reading Operatic Society could not offer amazing performance and back stage opportunities, amateur ticket prices for pro-level experiences and accessible theatre for our hearing

where she spends much of her time learning set lists and scripts then signing for theatres and music festivals. She designs her songs using a mixture of British Sign Language, Sign Supported English, expression and natural body language to get across the meaning of a song, while trying to stay true to its original feel and speed. She signed for EMINEM among a number of other big acts at last year's Reading Festival and just 3 weeks ago signed at the The Hexagon, Reading for the UK touring production of the musical *FAME*.

ROS are committed to making our shows accessible to Deaf and Disabled people and we are delighted that Stacey helps us to do so.





The Association has a membership of approximately 2000 amateur theatre groups and approximately 800 individual members staging musicals, operas, plays, concerts and pantomimes in a wide variety of venues ranging from the country's leading professional theatres to village halls. Covering a broad spectrum of age ranges NODA member societies meet the needs of all levels of both performers, whether dramatic, dance or musical, and those involved backstage, front of house or in society administration.

NODA aims:

• To give a shared voice to amateur theatre

· To help societies and individuals achieve the highest standards of best practice and performance.

 To provide leadership and advice to enable amateur theatre to tackle the challenges and opportunities of the 21st century

 To achieve these aims NODA is divided into eleven regions, each headed by a regional councillor who sits on the national council (ruling body of the Association), and supported by a network of regional representatives and of cials. NODA holds an annual residential Summer School (with bursaries available) offering training from professional tutors in a wide range of both performance and technical courses.

NODA also holds an annual national and regional programme and poster competition to encourage high standards in design. Through its trading arm, NODA Limited members have access to a varied range of products and services including insurance for both societies and individuals, long service awards that recognise the dedication made by individuals to amateur theatre, discounts on plays, vocal scores, libretti and technical books and a range of NODA branded merchandise. As a rights holder NODA Limited has 150 pantomimes by leading authors as well as a growing catalogue of plays and musicals.
