THE WIND IN THE WILLOWS

MESSAGE FROM CHAIR

WELCOME to the Haymarket Theatre for BAOS's 2021 production of *The Wind In The Willows*. I can't tell you how happy it makes me to say that after the last 18 months. It is wonderful for us to be back in The Haymarket, our performing home, and to see audiences returning to the theatre. After the challenges and sadness we have all had to deal with recently, we hope this show will transport you back to simpler times and put a huge smile on your faces.

The much-loved story of The Wind In The Willows has been given fresh energy in this relatively new adaptation. Julian Fellowes's book and the fabulous songs of George Stiles and Anthony Drewe revitalise the familiar characters so that we fall in love with Mole, Rat, Toad, Badger, the Otters and their friends all over again. Toad's outrageous behaviour is hilarious to us but disturbs the tranquil life of the others. It also leads to his imprisonment and victory for the Wild Wooders, led by the cunning Chief Weasel and her sidekicks. But following Toad's daring escape, this is ultimately a story of friends using their wits and working together to help one of their own, however little he deserves it.



Achieving success by pulling together and supporting each other is one of the things that I will take away from this production. We have faced changes to performance dates and resulting changes to the cast, restrictions on the number of people who could rehearse together indoors, the pingdemic hitting rehearsal attendance, and injury and illness leading to cast changes. We've missed the people who weren't able to continue and really hope to welcome them back for another production. But through it all we have encouraged and supported each other. And we have found ways to make it work, such as rehearsing via zoom or in my back garden (sometimes rather damply) in order to get the company together. We sang the opening number, Spring, with its optimism for the future, at our first 2021 company rehearsal and it felt like a new beginning! So my first thank you is to the cast, past and present, for their positivity and patience. And my second is to my neighbours who were very patient about our rehearsals and even claimed to enjoy them!

There are many other who have all had a different experience to the one they thought they would have when they joined this show! Adam (Director) and Simon (Musical Director) have been flexible, committed and supportive throughout, bringing their vision to life and the best out of the cast in unusual circumstances. Caroline and Owen have similarly worked tirelessly and innovatively in developing the show as ADs. Between them, Emily, Hollie and Abi put together some fabulous dance routines, and dance captains, Tracey and Kaz, have helped us perfect them. Thank you so much for your talents, energy and determination to get an amazing show on the stage.

We are incredibly grateful too to all who have contributed to the planning and running of this show. Our production and backstage teams are always brilliant. They too have coped admirably with changes to their preparations, as circumstances changed. After the intense disappointment of the cancellation of March 2020's My Fair Lady performances after the dress rehearsal, the BAOS committee has moved heaven and earth to make this show happen. And Anvil Arts staff have been unfailingly professional and supportive of our changing plans despite the effect the pandemic has had on theatres in general, and The Haymarket and Anvil specifically.

I should also like to thank those who have continued to run our youth group, BAOS Limelight. Stephanie Webb and Simon Eastwood used their imaginations and put enormous amounts of time and effort into online activities for and maintaining contact with our young people during lockdowns. Excitingly Limelight are currently working with BATS Next Gen towards a global event: performances of the musical revue *All Together Now* on 13th and 14th November. Further details will be announced in due course but please do support them in this.

Next year is an exciting one for BAOS, as it marks our centenary. We are planning various events to celebrate this, including a Centenary concert on 23^{rd} July, as well as our main production, Kinky Boots, from 30^{th} March to 2^{nd} April. We are allowing ourselves one week off before pre-audition rehearsals for Kinky Boots begin on 5^{th} October!

And finally thank you to you for supporting BAOS and The Haymarket. Now sit back and let the joy, renewal and cheer of Spring bring a smile to your faces as we take you into the world of The Wind In The Willows.



TALES FROM THE RIVERBANK

Like several classics penned during the golden age of children's literature, The Wind in the Willows was written with a particular child in mind.

Alastair Grahame was four years old when his father Kenneth began inventing bedtime stories about the reckless ruffian, Mr Toad, and his long-suffering friends: Badger, Rat, and Mole.

Alastair, born premature and partially blind, was nicknamed 'Mouse'. His rapture in the fantastic was later confirmed by his nurse, who recalled hearing Kenneth "up in the night-nursery, telling Master Mouse some ditty or other about a toad".

The Wind in the Willows evolved from Alastair's bedtime tales into a series of letters Grahame later sent his son while on holiday in Littlehampton. In the story, a quartet of anthropomorphised male animals wander freely in a pastoral land of leisure and pleasure — closely resembling the waterside haven of Cookham Dean where Grahame himself grew up.

In his will, he gifted the original manuscript of Willows to the Bodleian Library, along with the copyrights and all his royalties. Upon his death in 1932, he was buried in Oxford next to his first reader, Mouse.

NODA aims:


- To give a shared voice to amateur theatre

Quality Musical Entertainment to Inspire

Entertainment was very limited in Basingstoke in the early 1920s when BAOS was 'born' as the Thornycroft Amateur Operatic Society, to become pioneers in the world of amateur show business. It was all made possible as a result of a light-hearted conversation at May's Bounty cricket ground following a hockey match. Someone mentioned Gilbert and Sullivan to fire the imagination; word was then conveyed to management and employees at Thornycrofts.



Thornycrofts was a large manufacturer of commercial and military vehicles based on the site which is now Morrisons supermarket on Worting Road. In those days, Basingstoke had only seen modest concert parties in between the films and had never seen a light opera, with colourful costumes, a full orchestra and cleverly painted scenery to carry people away to places such as Venice, the Tower of London or Titipu in Japan. With the management realising what potential they had in the firm, the operatic society started. At that time, Thornycrofts had a fine military band with Robert Callaway as conductor, who went on to become the musical director for our first five productions. There was the work's canteen, with a splendid stage, and a good-sized auditorium. Among the personnel were several good singers and actors and it was three of these – Fred Cook, Ralph Burnaby and Ray Franklin – who conversed at May's Bounty and were in the first production which followed, HMS Pinafore on Thursday, February 23rd, 1922. The Society was launched, with productions drawing many patrons to the Thornycrofts' canteen in Worting Road.


